STAMFORD BRIDGE PFA - THE ROLE OF THE COMMITTEE

With just short of 550 members across our 5 sporting sections the trustees felt that there will be many members who are unaware of the role of the PFA and perhaps even who the trustees are and what they do. We decided therefore that it would be a good idea to put together this document so that all members are aware of what goes on behind the scenes and who the individuals are who manage our facilities.

The PFA is a registered charity and all trustees are volunteers. We currently manage two sites within the village. Low Catton Road is owned by Fields in Trust and our Reckondales site is owned by East Riding of Yorkshire County Council. Both of these sites are leased to the PFA.

Many of you will be aware of the new Brown Moor Football Field that is in development. This field has broadened the horizon of the PFA as due to the grant monies that we successfully negotiated with Chairman Bernard Stevens we have purchased this land and for the first time will become landowners. A new and exciting era however not without its challenges.

Essentially the role of the PFA is to manage the buildings and facilities of our sites. Our dedicated team of volunteers give up their time to perform these tasks with the common goal of providing sport and recreation for all those who reside in Stamford Bridge and its neighbouring villages.

We have experienced much growth and change in recent years, and are fortunate that we have a team with wide ranging skill sets that ensures that our practices and processes are of the highest order and of a standard that enables us to meet our legal responsibilities.

As Trustees we are accountable for the solvency and continuing effectiveness and preservation of the S.B.P.F.A. We exercise overall control of the financial and legal affairs and we ensure that the way the P.F.A. is administered is not open to abuse by associates or contractors. Our systems of control must therefore be rigorous and constantly maintained and developed as we grow and change.

S.B.P.F.A. is committed to being an equal opportunities organisation and we must ensure that we do not breach our Duty of Care. We constantly challenge ourselves to ensure equality of opportunity and fair treatment both as an organisation, and the provider of sport and recreation for our member Clubs.

In fact we need also to continually consider our responsibilities for planning succession of key Trustee Roles and also be aware of new skill sets that will be required in the future.

In recent weeks we have identified that as our sections expand we will require someone with a mechanical background to assist our sporting sections with the maintenance of their machinery and ensure that they are fit for purpose. After discussion with Ian Fraser we are delighted to advise that he has agreed to work with the PFA as a co-opted trustee. In this role Ian will be available to assist all sections. He will attend PFA meetings when the need arises and will be entitled to vote on any Agenda item for Facilities, Equipment, Machinery and Storage.

Bernard Stevens - Chairman
